Yarn requirements: Bamboo yarn Crochet hook no. 2.0 Finished width 1½ cm, 40 cm (40 cm - 50 cm)

TIP: If the bamboo yarn seems a bit too stiff, run it through your fingers a few times to soften it a little and make it easier to crochet with.

Abbreviations and symbol explanations

- ch = chain stitch
- dc = double crochet
- Idc = long double crochet
- 1. Crochet 6 ch + 1 ch for turning I Technique 1
- 2. Crochet 6 dc around the clasp () Technique 2
- 3. Crochet 6 dc (reverse side)
- Crochet 1 dc, 4 ldc, 1 dc (right side) [⊙] Technique 3 Continue for rows 3 and 4 until the desired length, changing colours as described below. Repeat x 12 = finished size 40 cm

Changing yarn

On the reverse side, use the new colour to pull through the last 2 loops, crochet 1 ch and turn. Place the old colour and end of the new colour along the work. When crocheting a row of ldc, make sure that the threads are secured inside the stitches.

- 5. Secure in the next stich by crocheting 2 dc together, 2 dc, 2 dc together.
- Crochet 4 dc + 1 ch for turning, back and forth in 5 rows (5-25 rows for a growing dog).
- 7. Attach the clasp, fold the collar to the desired length and crochet with chain stitches down into the collar.
- 8. Fold the collar into a tube and sew together with a kitchener stitch.
- 9. Make tassels as shown, attach with pendant in mini keyring ⁽⁾ Technique 4
- Embroider with double reflective cord, 3 stripes around using a backstitch ^O Technique 5
